



I would like to express my heartfelt thanks to the school for giving me various opportunities and trusting me for my initiatives. ENGLISH PUBLICATIONS

The English Department has been trying hard to provide different platforms for our students to showcase their English ability and share their learning achievements. With the support and guidance of our new principal Mr. Richard Choi, we have not only achieved our goal of publishing our very first full English publication, but have in fact surpassed it. We have published two brand new English publications – Hebron Times and Hebron Anthology.

English Newspaper Hebron Times 2021

The maiden issue of Hebron Times was published in late November last year, on the same day in which the parents' evening was held. The golden yellow front page of the brand new English newspaper caught the attention of parents, students and teachers by pleasant surprise, for it was the first time that we published a newspaper-styled newsletter in full English.

Hebron Times 2021 contained 8 A3 pages and 5 major parts – the principal's message, English panel head's sharing, English Friday, English overseas study tour and NET teachers' sharing. Hebron

Times highlighted the principal's vision of English development in this school, our English panel head Ms. Frances Law's insight into English education, our flagship English activity programme English Friday, our numerous overseas English study tours, as well as sharing from our two NET teachers.

With the publication of Hebron Times, we also launched a promotion campaign, which provided extra opportunities for our students to practise their English. Our S4 students Chloe Ho and Michael Chung recorded promotion videos which were broadcasted in the parents' evening, greeting parents and sharing the rationale behind publishing Hebron Times. The videos were shown in the school hall, the admission area, and were projected onto the 1st floor outer wall of our main building. In the subsequent week, students in the whole school took part in a Hebron Times content treasure hunt activity, reading and celebrating our very first English newspaper together.












English Anthology - Hebron Anthology

It has always been our goal to publish a full English anthology. With the collective effort of our students and English teachers, and the beautiful artwork provided by Ms. Ngan Tsui Yue, panel head of Visual Arts, the publication of the 60-page-long Hebron Anthology marked another milestone of English development in our school.

Hebron Anthology 2021 contained 60 pieces of English essays and 60 pieces of artwork - all produced by our very own students. The 60 pieces of English essays covered up-to-date topics such as "Silver Linings in My COVID-19 Days" and "Information Technology in 2020", enabling our students to respond to world issues and modern trends, especially during this turbulent year. The essays also covered topics such as "Gratitude" and "My Hebron Memory", allowing students to express their feelings towards people around them, as well as towards their school. The 60 pieces of artwork gave us a glimpse into the artistic talent of our students, adding both artistical depth and value to Hebron Anthology, complimenting and elevating the essays at the same time.





With the experience of having already launched a promotion campaign for Hebron Times earlier in the school year, both students and teachers had grown more ambitious and expectant towards the launch of Hebron Anthology. Hebron Anthology was launched in late May, on the same day in which we held our graduation

ceremony for our S6 students. This time, 15 students, together with the principal, recorded sharing videos about Hebron Anthology, which were shown to all the parents and guests attending the ceremony. A similar content treasure hunt activity was held in the subsequent week and all students in the school took part in it. Of course, the biggest reward was that Hebron Anthology was well received by both students and teachers, acknowledging the effort and recognizing the achievement of our student writers and student artists.

It is just the beginning of a long history to be written. The English publication in Assembly of God Hebron Secondary School saw its very successful first step last year. With the printing of postcards and bookmarks of Hebron Anthology as its extension, and the publication of this Hebron Times 2022, we see a bright future regarding the English publications in this school.








In order to keep the tradition of showing an interesting morning promotion video every Friday, the core hosts of English Friday decided to set up a studio green screen in each of their homes. The students made use of all the resources available to them to set up a green coloured backdrop at home, so that they could continue to record videos that enabled them to add special effects on when editing. The newly set up "studios" in different homes also brought the benefit that the student hosts were able to take off their masks when recording videos.

With the goal of keeping the same large number of English Friday participants yet still upholding safety measures and accommodating the half-day timetable, the student and teacher organisers decided to move the activities to Zoom, with a firm condition that the frequency and number of activities held had to remain the same.



Almost all of the English Friday monthly themes remained intact. In response to the lack of opportunity for students to go travelling, a new theme "Around the World" was introduced. With a combination of video showing, quiz competitions, questioning and answering, the fun nature of English Friday had been successfully kept.

Even with COVID-19, more than 300 students took part in English Friday last year.

As a staple of English activities in this school, English Friday will continue to adapt, prevail, and evolve.

MONTHLY THEMES

Board Games

With dozens of board games laid across multiple tables, it's a perfect time after lunch for junior form students to challenge each others' board game skills, under the help and guidance of senior form students, using English.









Chinese New Year

During the month of Chinese New Year, students get to enjoy one of the most interesting fusion activities - writing traditional Chinese New Year greeting messages in English! Students write their English messages on traditional Chinese red paper in Chinese calligraphy, and they get to bring the paper back to their homeroom for decoration!









Christmas

Christmas is the time for festivity and partying! With drinks, pizza, and Christmas songs, students mingle with each other and share the joy of the special occasion in English. Students will also enjoy crafting activities with different Christmas themes.



Movies

Who doesn't like blockbuster movies? The lunch time movie shows usually draw a large crowd. Students enjoy chilling with friends after lunch in the canteen, watching blockbuster movies such as Avengers and Pixar animation Luca. In addition to receiving entertainment, students learn English by participating in movie quizzes using iPads.



Technology

During the month of technology, students make use of iPads to play English educational games, and try out some of the latest technology such as augmented reality and virtual reality. Students also take part in English quizzes related to the latest development of technology in the world.



Creative Drawing

In multiple creative drawing sessions, students demonstrate their creativity and talent by producing large pieces of group drawings, then sharing about their creations in English. Teachers are constantly surprised by the collective effort and creativity of our students.



Singing and Dancing

For consecutive weeks, students give singing and dancing performances during lunch time for students to enjoy, also as auditions for English competitions. In the month of singing and dancing, the canteen area transforms itself into a "Got Talent"-styled stage!




Video Games

We embrace the fact that students are drawn to video games, and we try to take advantage of the popularity of video games in motivating students to use English. In addition to holding actual gaming sessions, we invite students to share pre-game strategies and post-game strategy reviews in English. We even have weeks of sessions exploring the history of video games in English.



Vocabulary Building

Helping students build a solid English foundation is one of the major focuses of the English Department. This year, we have decided to take one step further by refining our vocabulary building strategies, hoping to help students acquire more vocabulary through the introduction of a vocabulary building folder.



Each of our students was given a brand new, tailor-made vocabulary building folder in September this year. The idea is that students will bring along this vocabulary folder with them every day when they attend English lessons. Students will note down English words introduced to them, by their English teachers, via textbooks, or their own exposure in any other means. Students are encouraged to make good use of the dictionary, checking the meaning, parts of speech and example sentences of all the words they have noted down.




Around the school campus, it can easily be spotted that the vocabulary folder has already been put into good use by many students, which is a promising sight.

The school closures helped us look at solutions that we would have never considered before; it helped us appreciate the things we took for granted. EDUCATION BUREAU (EDB) OPTIMISING SENIOR SECONDARY ENGLISH LANGUAGE




In 2021, the Education Bureau put forward a plan to optimise the four senior secondary core subjects to create space for students and cater for learner diversity. After putting forward a proposal regarding the English Language curriculum framework to be adopted by our school in response to the change, our school was invited by the Education Bureau to aid the production of a video entitled "Flexible Arrangements to Cater for Learner Diversity; Multifarious Activities to Enhance English Learning".

During the process, our principal Mr. Richard Choi had the chance to share with the Education Bureau our plan and vision about English Language education in our school, especially in light of the new direction laid out by the Education Bureau. We are happy and honoured that our plan was positively recognised by the Education Bureau and we were invited to help explain and illustrate to the public the rationale and implementation details regarding this latest development in English Language education in Hong Kong.

In addition to the quality video made, the implementation of our put forward plan has been equally successful. As part of our Core Subjects Enhancement class, our dedicated English teachers have been executing our plan with very successful results. S4 students have enjoyed the new teaching module "Hebron Future Publishers" in the First Term immensely so far, and are eagerly looking forward to the other two modules "Hebron YouTubers" and "Hebron 21st Century Leaders" taking place in Mid-Term and Final Term respectively. According to course evaluation and student feedback, students have enjoyed particularly the flexibility in curriculum content design, extra lesson time and space in carrying out group discussions, presentations and interviews. Students also valued the individual attention and flexible arrangements provided to them, as reflected in both their reflection and learning progress.
